Looking Out for Crime Reports

Number 27 in a series of notes on important issues.

When we try to do our duty as responsible citizens or to do what we think is necessary to protect our vulnerable relatives and neighbours, occasions may arise when we need to make a report to the police or another body about criminal activity or what we suspect may lead to that activity. This note is designed to provide information that may help.

Emergency, Crime in Progress

If there are indications that there is a crime in progress, particularly if there is a threat to the life of or of physical harm to someone, or for that matter if someone is otherwise at risk to life or limb, the number to dial is always **999**. We should all know that.

The text phone number **1 8000** enables people who are deaf, hard-of-hearing or speech-impaired to contact the emergency services using a text phone. It is necessary to register a mobile phone if it is to be used for emergency SMS messages. For more information go to <http://www.emergencysms.org.uk/>. There is also a text to voice relay service. Non-Emergency Reports

We should also know that dialling **101** enables us to make the less time-critical crime reports. Those who are deaf, hard-of-hearing or speech-impaired and want to call 101 can use text phone **1 8001 101**. If we want to report a fraud, it is possible to do this by making a report online to Action Fraud – http://www.actionfraud.police.uk/report_fraud. This is a section of the City of London Police and their telephone number is **0300 123 2040**.
