You read it in the papers. Another atrocity, a bomb, a terrorist attack, innocent peopled killed or maimed in another place, perhaps far away or perhaps closer to home – perhaps somewhere you visited last week or a year ago. Sadly, news such as this can seem like a normal feature of modern life. Inside, you wonder – what if it happened to me? This sort of thing doesn't happen in Cornwall, does it?

In 2017, the government published 'Crowded Places Guidance'. The logo reproduced below give a hint of its scope. It is very detailed and it runs to 175 pages. That is an awful lot of reading. It is tempting to say – 'I can't be bothered with all that'. The reaction is a common one and totally understandable.

It is well designed and user-friendly (given the task it sets out to address) and it contains some key messages on personal security, 'RUN, TELL, HIDE' if you are caught up in an incident, and the pointers to (and reasons behind) what might be suspicious activity.
